But once in a while a film jets right past the boundaries of artfully contrived tearjerking into a kind of blunt hostage taking. Life Itself, written and directed by Dan Fogelman, the master manipulator behind televisions This Is Us, is so perversely jaw-dropping in its attempts to extort feelings out of us that it could almost be a black comedy. But no, this one is playing it straight.Life Itself tells the stories of a carousel of characters and the interlocking tragedies that befall them. Olivia Wilde and Oscar Isaac are adorably canoodling newlyneds expecting their first child. Olivia Cooke is a crabby faux punk who channels her painful past into horrible music. Theres a rich Spanish country gent (Antonio Banderas) who intrudes on the lives of the salt-of-the-earth couple (Sergio Peris-Mencheta and Laia Costa) who live on his property. Theres also a therapist, Annette Bening, charged with the thankless task of healing the pileup of wounds this screenplay inflicts on these characters.People being smacked by buses, children witnessing the death of parents, suicide born of deep despairand dont forget cancer. Its all there in Life Itself, including references to incest and murdered puppies. We dont actually see all of these things: Life Itself is a model of super discreet editing, and a largely unseen narrator catalogs some of the worst horrors in a way that allows us to remain comfortably detached. Welcome to the cozy zone of human tragedy: youll feel bad, but not too bad, and youll go home with so many bromides that youll have to rent a storage space to house them all.The premise of Life Itselfthat beauty and happiness can, and often does, spring from tragedyisnt so bad. But Fogelmans approachto throw one Velcro catastrophe after another at his target, us, figuring that somethings got to stickmight work better in short, episodic bursts than it does in a full-length movie. What hurts the most is the wholehearted dedication each of these actors brings to such truly horrendous material: they make Life Itself almost watchablealmostbut theres no effective cure for this kidney stone of a movie. Theres the story of a boy who watches as his mother is belittled and diminished by his abusive father. There are infidelity, madness, and peanut butter & jelly sandwiches. For the most part, Life Itself succeeds on an emotional level, which is as much a testimony to a series of strong performances as to Fogelmans screenplay. The filmmaker has assembled an impressive cast: Jackson (in what amounts to a cameo), Bening, Isaac, Wilde, Mandy Patinkin, Jean Smart, Olivia Cooke, and Antonio Banderas (among others). The standouts are Isaac, Cooke, Banderas, and (appearing later in the film in segments set in Spain) Laia Costa and Alex Monner. The actors imbue their characters with a humanity that transcends the storylines occasional contrivances. We became involved in their lives and feel deeply whenever the encroaching darkness sneaks up to touch them.Fogelman didnt set out to craft a downer of a movie and, although the numerous happy flashbacks have a double edge (sometimes, in the midst of grief, it can be painful to remember the most intense moments of joy), they lighten some of the burden. The ending is hopeful, although the wordiness of the final scene feels over-the-top. Its as if Fogelman, perhaps unsure the movie conveys his point, opts to be explicit. The movie works better without any narration (excepting the jokey Samuel L. Jackson material at the outset); its unnecessary and distracting. Overall, however, I appreciated the care with which the characters are developed and the respect accorded to their circumstances. There are a lot of nice little touches (the homages to Pulp Fiction and the decision to subtitle the portion of the film set in Spain) and, although the movies strength occurs early in the proceedings, it tells a story worth being told.(Note: This is the second movie with this name to be released in the last few years. The other Life Itself was a 2014 documentary biography of film critic Roger Ebert. The two productions have nothing in common except the title.) Life Itself is convoluted. Not to be confused with the title of Roger Eberts memoir, Dan Fogelmans Life Itself packs in enough narrative twists and turns to leave viewers with a sense of emotional whiplash. One tragedy bleeds into another so often that the events begin to blur. How like life itself.Now, if you want tofeel every bump on the movies emotional roller coaster, then go in knowing as little about it as possible. Feel what you feel and enjoy the ride. For folks who dont mind a little more details before buying a ticket, read on. Will (Oscar Isaac) is a disheveled man whos clearly going through a tough time. He abandons working on a terrible script in a New York City coffee shop to refill on caffeine, booze, and Xanax. He then disturbs the peace and is promptly thrown out of the cafe. Will reluctantly saunters off to his therapist (Annette Bening) for a mandated session, where through terse exchanges between doctor and patient, he finally opens up about whats troubling him: his wife, Abbey (Olivia Wilde), her absence, his institutionalization and that hes a father of a child he hasnt yet seen. Just as it feels like were heading to some semblance of catharsis, Wills story ends abruptly. The movie skips ahead a few chapters to his daughters morose childhood and rebellious early adulthood. Dylan (Kya Kruse when young, Olivia Cooke when older) grows nostalgic for the parents she never knew. With almost no warning, Life Itself uproots itself again, this time moving from a tragedy-ridden New York City to a much calmer, slower-paced Spain. Here, the narrative finds Mr. Saccione (Antonio Banderas), a wealthy landowner, in talks to promote his dedicated, soft-spoken laborer, Javier (Sergio Peris-Mencheta). The men enter into an uneasy agreement where Javier will help manage Mr. Sacciones olive orchards, but he asks that his boss try not to be friends with him. The promotion allows Javier to marry his girlfriend Isabel (Laia Costa), enjoy a spacious home and start a family. Over time, Mr. Saccione grows a bit too friendly with Isabel, and their young son, Rodrigo (Adrian Marrero, later played by lex Monner), and Javier attempts to defend his boundaries. However, after Rodrigo is traumatized by witnessing a horrible accident, he needs special treatment that only a rich benefactor like Mr. Saccione could afford. A family drama ensues, as does the couples separation and later, Isabels cancer diagnosis and Rodrigos departure to college inwait for itNew York City. True to Fogelmans multilayered, melodramatic NBCseries, This is Us, Life Itself revels in its storys highs and lows. An accident will be followed by a suicide, or a prank followed by news of a characters death. The movie only narrowly misses the most predictable of cliches by jolting the audience with a steady diet of unfortunate events. Adding to that disorientating feeling is the films cycle through various characters. Its an approach better suited for a drawn-out TV show, but in the short runtime of a movie, the effect is lacking. No sooner do we start to feel empathetic for one characters struggles than were moving on to find someone else to attach to. A few repetitive themes and musings overstay their welcome, none more egregious than the constant reminder that we are being led by an unreliable narrator who iswitholding knowledge. Its like a kid on Halloween whooges to the same house many times, with each subsequent appearance wearing on our patience. This is how the movie accounts for its revolving carousel of characters, but in trying to smarten up the mushy plot, the narrative device becomes a nuisance. That isnt to say the performances in Life Itself are bad. Thankfully, the cast is stocked with many experienced actors who give the drama-laden script their all. Isaac does his best impression of a man haunted by the loss of his wife and his mind. Mandy Patinkin takes a quiet approach to his role as Wills father, making him a kind of gentle pushover for his granddaughter, Dylan, whos still her rock through their shared losses. Banderas makes his character difficult to figure out whether he can really be trusted, enhancing that storys tension. Costa perhaps has the best role as the long-suffering wife caught between two mens egos. Wilde is believable in her role, which changes depending onhow Will remembers their interactions. She hasseen through his experiences. Abbey never quite feels like a fully formed character but more likea tragic mystery to solve. This cast parade means the young talents of Cooke and Monner never quite have enough time to make an impression. All we see of Dylan is that she is petulant and short-tempered, the frontwoman of the least believable punk band in a movie. Monner has a bit more time to embody the varying emotions of Rodrigo as he leaves his dying mother to go to college. Monner earns one of the best laughs in the movie during the awkward Aprils Fool lunch he has with his freshman year girlfriend; but of course, this moment of brevity is short-lived when devastating news arrives as soon as he walks into his dorm room. Ultimately, Life Itself plays like a soap opera squeezed into two hours. Some people will like it, enjoying a TV seasons worth of heartbreak in a bite-size binge. In my case, I left dazed from the multigenerational journey and wondering if my post-screening feelings were side effects from becoming too numbed or overwhelmed by schmalz. Life Itself loads up plot line on top of plot line to imitate emotional depth, a kind of narrative manipulation thatjust doesnt work for everyone.
