Additionally, adverbs like "highly successful" or "extremely difficult" can intensify or modify adjectives. - Highly successful - Extremely difficult Common prepositions like "in trouble", "on time", and "by chance" also have specific uses in collocations. - In trouble - On time - By chance Finally, verbs like "depend on", "believe in", and "suffer from" typically follow particular prepositions to form meaningful phrases. - Depend on - Believe in - Suffer from
